Dr Roshan Paul, new Director of the Indo-German Science and Technology Centre (IGSTC) called on Ambassador Dr Martin Ney on 23rd January at the German Embassy.

In the presence of Stephan Lanzinger, Head of the Science and Technology Department of the German Embassy New Delhi, they discussed the role of IGSTC in enhancing bilateral collaboration and ways to further promote collaboration between German and Indian scientific institutions.

Dr Roshan Paul has been serving as the Director of Indo-German Science and Technology Centre since 1st December 2016.

The Indo-German Science & Technology Centre (IGSTC) was established by the Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India, and the Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF), Germany, to facilitate Indo-German R&D networking through substantive interactions among government, research system and industry, thus fostering innovation for overall economic and societal developments in both countries. In 2015, the tenure of the centre was extended until 2022 with its funding being doubled to 8 million Euros (around 56 Crore Rupees) per year.

Through its flagship program “2+2 Mode of Partnership”, IGSTC intends to catalyse innovation-centric R&D projects by synergising the strength of research & academic institutions and public & private industry from India and Germany.
